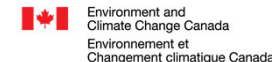
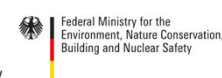
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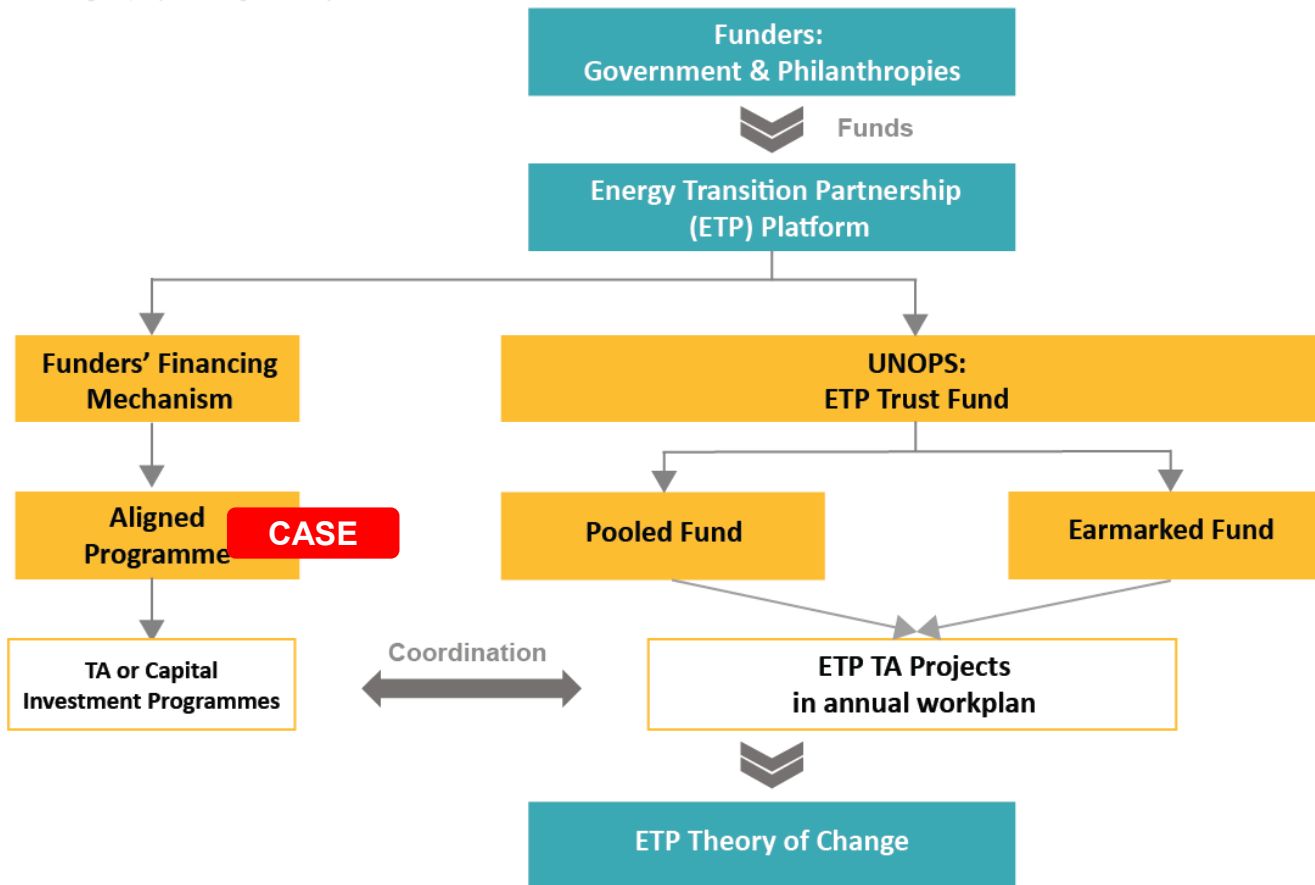

Aligned programmes

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Technical assistance or capital investment programmes aligned to ETP theory of change but funded by ETP funders through their own mechanism. Coordination at governance and operational level with ETP

Current aligned programmes:

- CASE (GIZ): BMU - TA programme (20 M Euro)

Under consideration for alignment:

- Sustainable Infrastructure Programme (SIP) in SEA region - BEIS (UK) - Capital Assistance and TA programme (177 M Pounds)
- Climate change programme - Canada - Capital assistance (275 M Can\$)
