| Recognition    | acknowledgement of distinct and diverse identities and histories of people in affected communities, including forms of exclusion, in relation to the energy system |

- Strengthening access and overcoming energy poverty, including for remote and rural areas
- Broader participation of stakeholders and affected communities
- Just Transitions as decent work and quality jobs
