Energy justice principles

Distributional	equal and equitable distribution of benefits and burdens related to energy production and consumption
Procedural	equal and meaningful participation of all stakeholders in energy decisions
Recognition	acknowledgement of distinct and diverse identities and histories of people in affected communities, including forms of exclusion, in relation to the energy system

Just energy transitions

Fair distribution of the benefits, risks and burdens of (renewable) energy production and consumption across society

- Strengthening access and overcoming energy poverty, including for remote and rural areas
- Broader participation of stakeholders and affected communities
- Just Transitions as decent work and quality jobs
